What is 321?

3-2-1 is a Run England project which aims to provide a range of marked out running or jogging routes across the country, so anyone can have a go. It is a way of providing a meaningful challenge to help more people get running when it best suits them.

Here at Norman Scott Park we have a 1 kilometre course with posts at 100 metres intervals. You may wish to:

- (a) Jog or run to the first post and walk to the next one etc.
 - (b) alternate running fast for 200m or more with slower, recovery jogs
 - (c) progress to walking or running more laps at your chosen pace
- It's up to you!

Norman Scott Park

Patchway Town Council owns and maintains this park, which is named after the first Chairman of the Council. In 2013 the park was registered as a Queen Elizabeth II Jubilee Field. The park has a children's play area with accessible equipment, a floodlit skateboard area, a picnic area, copses planted for wildlife as well as three football pitches, a cricket pitch and a floodlit, hard court. Changing facilities are provided for sports use in the pavilion on the left of the main entrance.
