South West Child Protection Procedures

What is Forced Marriage?

In a forced marriage, one or both spouses do not consent to the arrangement of the marriage and some elements of duress are involved. Duress can include physical, psychological, financial, sexual and emotional pressure. Forced Marriage is an abuse of human rights and, where a child is involved, an abuse of the rights of the child.

Increased likelihood of domestic abuse and sexual abuse.
Coercive and controlling methods to control the victim.
Women men and younger members of the family can be involved in perpetrating the abuse, there can be instances of child trafficking, false imprisonment and threats to kill. Victims may be taken abroad under the pretext of a family holiday or wedding.

What are the risks?

Forced Marriage Protection Order

Anyone threatened with forced marriage or forced to marry against their will can apply for [Forced Marriage Protection Order](#). Third parties, such as relatives, friends, voluntary workers and police officers, can also apply for a protection order with the leave of the court. Breaching a Forced Marriage Protection Order is a criminal offence. Forcing someone to marry can result in a sentence of up to 7 years in prison. Disobeying a Forced Marriage Protection Order can result in a sentence of up to 5 years in prison.

Who do I contact?

Attempts to discuss with the family could increase the risk for the child.
