SOUTH WESTERN AMBULANCE SERVICE



Simon Hester presented to the Board

1 million 999 calls annually | 7 counties | 5000 staff

Ambulance crews are trained to be astute reporters of safeguarding concerns. They attend when people are unprepared and in crisis. In 2016 ambulance staff made 13,000 referrals into other agencies in South Glos.

Challenge to agencies – only 6% of referrals made receive any feedback to the ambulance service about outcomes.



FAMILY NURSE PARTNERSHIP

Suzi shared the story of "Sarah". Sarah is a 19 year old Care Leaver who has poor mental health and has been sectioned under the mental health act on a number of occasions. She has previously had very poor engagement with services. Suzi described Sarah's journey through pregnancy and how she worked with Sarah over a two year period to support her as she became a Mum.
