
## **Brook Traffic Light Tool**

# Learn about your local SENDIAS service and how we can work together





SENDIAS service provides information, advice and support (IAS) to children and young people with any type of special educational need and/or disability (SEND) and their parents and carers that is FREE, CONFIDENTIAL & IMPARTIAL

Our goals at Supportive Parents are to provide information, advice, support and training, work together, promote participation and enable decision-making.

#### Who Can Use the SENDIAS Service?

- Children and young people with SEND can use our service independently to ensure their views are shared, they understand educational processes and can contribute in decisions about their future. Resources are available (Videos about SENDIAS services for CYP, Easy Read factsheets and resources, How to get in touch with us.)
- Parents and carers with parental responsibility can use Supportive Parents' service to understand their rights and the rights of their children and young people with SEND, as well as to learn about processes and policies, and voice their views. They can also use our service to support them with practical guidance and support. More information on our website and our range of resources on a variety of topics
- **Professionals** are able to use the information, advice and support on offer to build their own knowledge and understanding as well as enabling parents and carers, and children and young people with SEND to access the SENDIAS service.

  - Our information resources and toolkits
  - Support Group and events.

## Professionals Working with Service Users Who need Additional Support

We rely on professionals' expertise and experience regarding those they work with to ensure an effective IAS service delivery.

Where professionals tell us about potential users of our service, being clear about the type of support families, including parents and carers, foster parents or others need, will help us make adjustments where necessary, when offering IAS.

#### What We Cover

Our service covers all aspects of special educational needs and disabilities, including social care and health concerns, appeals, complaints and exclusions where SEND may be identified or suspected.

Examples of the range of information we cover are:

- Statutory work, which may lead to an Education Health and Care Plan (EHCP) and beyond.
- concerns from the earliest stages of getting help
- SEN Support in schools
- Ways of accessing services to support education
- Signposting to other services
- Disagreement resolution

#### Additional useful Information

We have a **Volunteer Project Lead** who works to recruit and support volunteers in a variety of roles. We encourage anyone to apply to volunteer with the Supportive Parents team if they are interested in working within a SENDIAS service or have knowledge and skills that they would like share.

We have also recently recruited a **CYP Practitioner** to increase the profile of Supportive Parents among children and young people (CYP) with SEND. We are keen to increase the amount of children and young people making contact with us directly for information, advice, support and advocacy.
