

Child Safety Week: Safety Sorted

The theme this year aims to assure families that by making small changes they can be confident that they are reducing the risk of injury to their children.

The <u>Child Accident Prevention Trust</u> (<u>CAPT</u>) has many resources, fact sheets and session plans to support practitioners when discussing and raising the issue of how to prevent injuries among children and young people. The Child Injury prevention pages for <u>professionals</u> highlight the main causes of injury to children and how to prevent them. There's also a <u>checklist</u> available to help families consider the hazards in their home.


Voice of the Child



NSPCC Learning has published a briefing summarising learning from case reviews to support improved practice around the voice of the child. The briefing is based on a sample of case reviews published between 2019 and 2023 where practice issues around hearing the voice of the child were a key factor. Learning includes:

understanding what the voice of the child is; incorporating the child's voice into assessments and arrangements; gaining appropriate skills and knowledge to understand and reflect upon the child's voice; and building relationships to ensure the child's voice is heard and understood. Financially Motivated Sexual Extortion



There has been a global increase in reporting of children and young people, particularly teenage males, being forced into paying money or meeting another financial demand after an adult offender has threatened to release nudes or seminudes of them. This is financially motivated sexual extortion, sometimes referred to as 'sextortion', and is a form of child sexual abuse.

The National Crime Agency has issued an alert to education settings that provides advice on how to:

- recognise the signs of financially motivated sexual extortion
- raise awareness and support children to seek help
- support victims
