# Safety in Mind – 6th-12th June

Child Safety Week will take place from  $6^{th} - 12^{th}$  June and this year the theme is 'Safety in Mind'. Reducing childhood injury remains a priority for public health, unintentional injury, especially in and around the home for the underfives is a major cause of ill health and disability. In 2020/21 104.6 (per 10,000) 0-4-year-olds and 71.9 per 10,000 0 -14 year olds in South Gloucestershire were admitted to hospital due to an unintentional or deliberate injury. As the effects of injury can be devastating it's essential that we do all we can to avoid them, we can all take simple steps, consider the potential hazards and 'keep safety in mind' to avoid them.

# South Gloucestershire Creative Solutions Board



A Creative Solutions Board (CSB) is an opportunity to bring complex individuals (over 18) and families, who have complex needs but for whom 'business as usual' or our local system of support is not working, to a multi-agency board of decision makers from key organisations. The CSB will then work together to come up with creative solutions to 'flex' the system and attempt to unblock some of the issues that exist.

Who is on the CSB? The CSB has an independent chair, and a core group of senior representatives from key organisations such as AWP, DHI, adult and children's social care, housing, police and preventative services as well as representatives with lived experience. Other organisations are also invited to input as appropriate. The CSB Coordinator supports the running of the board, manages the requests and supports practitioners who present at the CSB.

**How does it work?** The CSB aims to find and agree solutions for individuals and families with complex needs for whom the system has hit a 'block' in their support and outcomes, often due to processes and procedures. The CSB hears from practitioners supporting those individuals/families, talks through the challenges and issues and agrees actions and solutions. The CSB will also work to develop system change so that similar blocks are avoided in the future. The CSB takes place monthly, focussing on 1 or 2 individuals or families at each session. The practitioner will have support from the coordinator to bring together the correct information and present the individual/family to the CSB. Any actions agreed by the CSB will be led by the practitioner with support from the coordinator. In addition, other practitioners/organisations may be asked to feed into the information for an individual/family who being discussed at the CSB or even to attend if they can provide additional insight. *Please note – this process is to support those for whom 'business as usual' has not worked. It is not to replace any existing work, and it is not a referral to a new service or a new support worker. It is also not a funding stream.*

**Practitioner Network** A practitioner network is taking place virtually on the last Wednesday of every month. This is open to internal and external practitioners who are working with complexity and want to share best practice, build relationships and share any blocks or barriers they are facing. Feedback from practitioners will also be an opportunity for the CSB to work together to come up with creative solutions for these issues.

# Adult Exploitation



The Safeguarding Adults Board has multiagency guidance about Adult Exploitation.

Remember that sexual exploitation of adults may have taken place even if the person being exploited believes they have given consent to engage in sexual activity.

Participants on this course have rated it 10/10 for skills and improvement in knowledge

Have you thought about training for you and your organisation? The SAB Self Audit in 2021 showed that practitioners lack confidence in working with adults at risk of exploitation.
