Free Prescriptions for Care Leavers

Bristol, North Somerset and South Gloucestershire Integrated Care Board are committed to improving the support provided to young people leaving care in Bristol, North Somerset and South Gloucestershire.

As part of this commitment, the Integrated Care Board now offers free prescriptions to eligible care leavers aged 18 until their 25th birthday.

To access the service, eligible care leavers need to apply for a certificate which can be shown to pharmacists when collecting prescriptions.

Gas Safety Week - 9th-15th September

As the days start to grow shorter and temperatures begin to drop, it'll soon be time to start thinking about getting our homes ready for winter. Gas Safety Week is the perfect opportunity to ensure your home is safe and warm for the colder months ahead.

Why gas safety matters

Gas appliances, if not properly maintained, can pose serious risks, including gas leaks, fires, and carbon monoxide poisoning. Regular checks and maintenance are crucial to keep your home safe.

Top tips for a cosy, safe and worry-free winter

- 1. **Check appliances**: Ensure all gas appliances are in good working order. Look out for warning signs like yellow flames, black marks, or unusual smells.
- 2. **Book an annual service**: Always use a registered engineer to service your boiler and other gas appliances.
- 3. Ventilation is key: Make sure vents and chimneys are clear to allow proper ventilation.
- 4. **Know the signs of a gas leak**: Familiarise yourself with the smell of gas and know what to do in case of a leak.
- 5. **Install and check carbon monoxide alarms**: These alarms can save lives by detecting dangerous levels of carbon monoxide so check that yours are in date. Play <u>Crack the Code</u> to learn more about carbon monoxide safety.
