# ELECTIVE HOME EDUCATION

Guy Halley spoke to the board and brought the Annual report for Children Missing Education and Children who are Home Educated (EHE).

240 children are home educated in South Gloucestershire, this number has been steadily rising. South Gloucestershire has a part time (0.4) support teacher and a part time education officer (0.5) and children are visited every year, some families elect not to meet with the local authority officers. A trend on social media was highlighted where support groups for families give advice not to meet with the local authority.

- Many families who are home educating their children do a good job and provide suitable education
- ✓ The number of home educated children who go on to attend college in year 10 & 11 has increased significantly

There are concerns for the SGSCB that:

- Some schools are suggesting EHE as an alternative to their child being excluded, the board will write to schools in South Gloucestershire about this.
- There are 70 children missing education in South Gloucestershire. Many of these have moved abroad, and are being followed up. Reminder to go to schools to ensure they gather information about forward plans of families who move away.
