South Gloucestershire Violence Reduction Partnership

South Gloucestershire is a safe place to live and work but incidents of serious violence do occur.

Knife crime has a devastating impact on communities and individuals. South Gloucestershire's Violence Reduction Partnership is committed to educating

young people about the dangers and impacts of knife crime and is working hard to keep them safe.

In South Gloucestershire, there are a number of bleed kits which can be used to help save lives in catastrophic trauma incidents and also knife surrender bins, where people can place knives and bladed weapons without question or fear of prosecution. #### Carbon Monoxide (CO) Awareness Workshop in Bristol (25th April)

The Gas Safe Charity is delighted to be working with Wales & West Utilities and Avon Fire and Rescue Service to deliver a free, half day workshop at the Lifeskills Centre in Bristol on the morning of the 25th April. We will be working with other local partners to share information about CO risks, particularly during this cost of living crisis.

The workshop is aimed at **ANYONE** who supports vulnerable people. You will learn about the sources, signs and symptoms of CO poisoning as well as prevention and information about resources available to help vulnerable people. The long term impact of low level CO poisoning can be serious and a high level incident is life threatening.
