

The audit of 2nd August 2023 reviewed the records of six adults who were identified through Adult Safeguarding under the theme of Exploitation. The aim of the audit was to ascertain whether there were good multiagency standards for managing cases and whether organisations have implemented a robust and consistent response in line with statutory and good practice guidance, SGSAB policies and procedures and the six key principles underpinning all adult safeguarding work. This theme is being revisited to look for progress and impact of change.

The adults reviewed for this multi agency audit are aged between 20 and 70. 3 are female and 3 male. 4 live in their own or rented home, one in a supported housing scheme and one lives with parents.

The adults in the audit have a range of issues in addition to Exploitation including alcohol and substance misuse, cancer, domestic abuse, learning difficulties, mental health, ADHD, Self Harm, missing episodes

What Good Practice did we see?

- Excellent practice from the neighbourhood police team working with an adult
- Good practice and persistence from agencies working together despite the adult not wanting help from professionals.
 Several of these cases showed excellent practice
- Voice of adult is heard
- Good triangulation of care with family members
- Mentoring service provided to support an adult when moving property for safety
- Need for a Specialist Complex Needs ISVA identified and provided, but has not been able to engage the adult so far
- Referral from Lloyd's bank when financial concerns identified
- Fraud Protect Team have worked with one adult who was identified as at risk of SCAMs
- Evidence of multi agency meetings
