What

is Domestic Abuse?

The Domestic Abuse Act 2021 says that behaviour is 'abusive' if it consists of any of the following:

- a. Physical or sexual abuse;
- b. Violent or threatening behaviour;
- c. Controlling or coercive behaviour;
- d. Economic abuse:
- e. Psychological, emotional or other abuse;

Under the 2021 Domestic Abuse Act children are now viewed as victims of Domestic Abuse if the Abuse is happening between their parents/carers.

There are many signs that domestic abuse is taking place. The government has produced this <u>helpful guide</u>.

It is really important that when you think domestic abuse is happening you use the DASH (Domestic Abuse Stalking & Harassment) tool to identify levels of risk. The DASH tool is here and there is also a young person's DASH here.
