Some of you will know me already, as I've been an Adult Social Worker (hospital and community), working with people with Dementia, Learning Disabilities, Mental Health and Physical Disabilities. Prior to working for the Council, I worked in Careers Advice and Guidance, Employment and Training and worked within Social Care with people with Mental Health Difficulties and Learning Disabilities, Looked After Children and children and families experiencing bereavement. Throughout my time at the Council, I've really enjoyed working in the first phase of the 3 Conversations pilot and a being a Practice Educator alongside my role. All of these experiences helped me to realise how important staff development is to me in my work.

I'm really excited about my new role in supporting our internal teams and external partners to take advantage of the CPD opportunities on offer to practitioners from organisations working with children and adults in South Gloucestershire. I'm really interested in how we can embed the learning from Safeguarding reviews into our training offer and via our day to day supervisions and peer led CPD sessions.

There is such a wealth of knowledge and expertise amongst health and social care practitioners in our networks. I'm particularly interested in identifying and harnessing the skills, knowledge and expertise that exists within our networks to enhance our excellent CPD offer.

I am interested in engaging practitioners in CPD and look at ways in which staff can be supported to invest more time in their own development of their knowledge of safeguarding- whilst safeguarding their own wellbeing.
