

The Prevent
Strategy is part
of our UK counterterrorism strategy
called Contest.





Prevent is all about reducing the threat of terrorism by stopping people becoming terrorists or supporting terrorism.

## Prevent aims to:

- Respond to the ideological challenge of terrorism and its threats
- Work with sectors or institutions where there are possible risks of radicalisation
- Prevent people from being drawn into terrorism and give them advice and support.



An important element of this is Channel – local multi-agency panels which identify and protect vulnerable people – stopping them from being drawn into terrorism.

Channel – local multi-agency panels to protect people from being drawn into terrorism









Channel panels always have a Local Authority Chair and involve the police. Other multi-agency participants can include:
